Postmarks on Postcards lists a Kearney Branch of San Diego, established 8/15/17, and discontinued 7/31/21. Previous to this Branch, there was a Linda Vista Military Branch of San Diego, established 6/11/17 and changed to Kearney Branch 8/15/17. Even earlier than the Linda Vista Branch, there was a Military Branch of San Diego,

established 6/1/17 and discontinued 6/11/17.


Williams records the Linda Vista Military Branch handstamp used from 7/23/17 to 8/25/19.

The Kearny Branch used two different types of Universal machines, type DSB-300, the first dial die type being seen from 10/1/17 to 1/28/18. The second dial die has been seen from 1/8/18 to 6/16/20. I also have duplex handstamps from this Branch, dated 2/11/18 and 4/11/18. Both machine types and the handstamp are illustrated.


I must be assumed that many military branches had the double-circle handstamp used to mark registered mail. However, few examples exist of these markings. I have illustrated the only example I've seen of this handstamp for the Kearney Branch used 11/5/17.

I have a picture postcard with the Universal machine cancel, but with a return address of "Linda Vista Cal." (illustrated). The return address also notes that this soldier was a member of the National Guard of Colorado, some of the first troops to occupy the camp.

As for the Linda Vista Military Branch duplex handstamp, I have seen examples dated 4/23/17 (illustrated), and 9/13/17.
