Introduction

This article reports the current results of my census of the American flag machine cancellations for military facilities. This census started back in 1993, but I continue to update my database as new dates are discovered or reported to me. The flag cancels I am studying are those primarily described on page 62 of Frederick Langford's "Flag Cancel Encyclopedia", 3rd Edition. In this follow-up article, I have only listed the dates of usage, and counts for the items. Some new EKU and LKU dates have appeared over the intervening years. Also, I have added a couple of items that probably qualify as military markings. They were noted elsewhere in Langford's book, and for convenience, I have listed them here. Work on these items is incomplete, and more information is requested of the members of the MCS. As is usual, I heartily thank the members who have sent me new dates, since the last printing of my census results. Some of the additional folks who have helped in recent years include:

The Current Listing of American Flag Machines

This listing is ordered by State, with no regard to Army or Navy.

In the following listings, EKU means earliest known usage date, LKU means latest known usage date. If the date is followed by (NC), this means that this date was reported, but I have not seen the item or a confirming photocopy.

Where the American flag machine was followed by a Universal machine, I will indicate the earliest reported date of the Universal machine by using the notation (U mm/dd/yy). The Universal dates were taken from listings I have been maintaining, and which have been recently updated by Bob Payne.

EKU 9/20/17 : Last reported 1917 use 11/16/17 : One example seen in 1918, dated 7/5/18
(U 11/6/17) : 53 examples reported

San Francisco, Cal., Fremont Branch, A-38

EKU 11/19/17 (only 1917 use known) First 1918 use: 2/6/18 : LKU 11/ 8/18 : 64 examples reported

Vallejo, Cal., Mare Island Naval Branch, A-38

EKU (example reported to Langford from 1917, but month/day not known)
Earliest 1918 usage, 7/19/18 : LKU 7/17/22 : 38 examples reported

Jacksonville, Fla., Navy Yard Station, A-38

No examples reported. Note also, that in my research on military bases, I have found no record that indicates that any Navy Yard ever operated in Jacksonville, Florida.

Atlanta, Ga., Gordon Branch, C-14

No examples reported. My Army research shows that the camp real estate and buildings were put up for sale in 1920, and the site was abandoned September, 1921. The latest date I've recorded for the Universal machine at Camp Gordon is 8/14/19. "Fort Gordon", an entirely different military base, was later established near Augusta, Georgia.

EKU 1/26/18 : Latest 1918 date reported is 10/14/18, which is the only October date reported

Chattanooga, Tenn., Military Branch, A-38 1917-1918 (first die)

EKU 8/ 1/17 : 180+ examples reported

September/October 1918 dates confirmed:

9/3, 9/11, 9/12, 9/13, 9/14, 9/17, 9/19, 9/20, 9/24, 9/25, 9/27, 10/3, 10/6, 10/8, 10/11, 10/13,
10/14, 10/16, 10/20, 10/22, 10/27

LKU 10/27/18

These dates overlap with those of the second die. See below for more information.

Chattanooga, Tenn., Military Branch, A-38 (second die)

Unconfirmed, but reported, 1918 use: 9/19, 9/24, 10/8, 10/9

The following are confirmed dates (all 1918), based on photocopies that I have received:

9/27, 9/28, 9/29, 10/1, 10/4, 10/5, 10/11, 10/13, 10/27

Note the overlap of dates with the first die. The dates of use for the Military Branch A-38 killer connect neatly with those for the Greenleaf Branch and Forrest Branch A-38 killers.

Fort Bliss, Texas, A-14 1917-21 (first die)

EKU 6/28/17 : LKU 7/16/21 : 66 examples reported.

Two examples are reported for 1921. It is unclear to me whether these are of the first die type or a later die type. I need confirming photocopies of ALL Fort Bliss items from 1921 and later.

Fort Bliss, Texas, A-14 (second die) 21-24

EKU 7/16/21 : LKU 8/ 8/22 : 8 examples reported.

All Fort Bliss cancels from 1921 and later need verification of type. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

Fort Bliss, Tex., A-14 (third die) 24-28

EKU 3/30/26 : LKU 12/12/27 : 6 examples reported

El Paso, Tex., A-14 (used at Fort Bliss) 16-17

Two examples reported, dated 5/18/17 and 6/8/17. Many more must exist. See page 52 of FCE. Please send photocopies of this, and the following El Paso machine.

Fort Bliss, Tex., A-38 (International Dry Farming slogan) 16

EKU 9/24/16 : LKU 9/29/16 : 2 examples reported so far, but many others must exist. See page 71 of FCE. Please send photocopies of this, and the previous machine.

EKU 5/ 9/34 (NC) : LKU 9/21/35 : 12 examples reported **

** Note that these flag cancels may be much more common than my figures indicate. During the 1930's, many collectors sent their covers to the postmaster at these facilities for cancellations. This traffic probably far exceeded that from the normal mail of the military facility.
